MESSAGE FROM OUR BOARD CHAIR

Dear Friends,

Receiving a cancer diagnosis can be one of the scariest and loneliest moments in a person's life. When I was diagnosed with cancer 13 years ago, I had so many unanswered questions and concerns. I didn't know what to do or where to turn. I longed for a community that could help me navigate the health system, answer my questions, and point me to resources to help me understand my options so I could make informed decisions. I longed for a community like the Patient Empowerment Network.

Now, as PEN's Board Chair, it is my honor and privilege to work with an amazing group of volunteers and staff who devote themselves on a daily basis to supporting people impacted by a cancer diagnosis.

Our impact on this community is vast: through our programming this past year, we reached over 362,500 individuals! In the pages ahead you'll learn more about our growing portfolio of programs that support our continued growth and impact.

We attribute our strong growth in large part to our continued strategic focus to grow our Path to Empowerment Framework, which we expanded into four additional cancer areas to include advanced bladder cancer, non-melanoma skin cancer, and two additional non-Hodgkin lymphoma subtype cancers: follicular lymphoma and Waldenstrom's disease. We are now supporting cancer patients and care partners across 18 different cancer types.

I extend my gratitude to my fellow board members who generously volunteer their time and resources towards PEN's mission: LaWanda Byrd, Nancy Gatschet, Alyssa Gutjahr, Sajjad Iqbal, Ray Parisi, Sujata Dutta, Andrea Marquez, and Eric Vicks, and our General Counsel, Tom Pedreira, and a special welcome to our newest board member, Lauri Bolton. In 2022, PEN was able to reach more people with cancer and their care partners than ever. Our widerange of programs brought informational and educational resources to over **362,500 people**.

We expanded our disease areas to **18** with the additions of Follicular Lymphoma, Waldenström Macroglobulinemia, Bladder Cancer, and Skin Cancer.

Provides a curated, actionable 'Start Here' list of resources from PEN's vast library which is customized for each constituent.



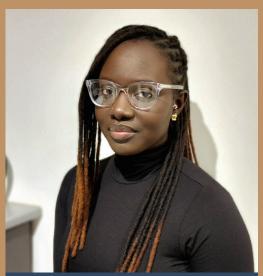
EMPOWERING PROVIDERS TO EMPOWER PATIENTS (EPEP)

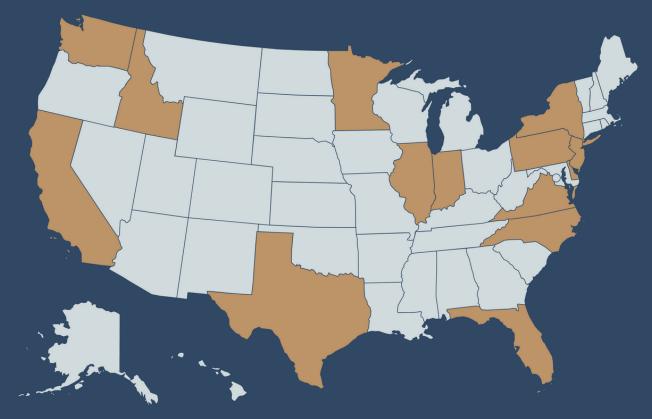
SABRINA OCASIO

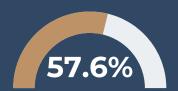

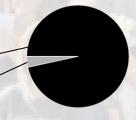
FUNDRAISING

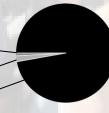

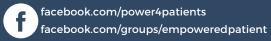
