- **Definition and Types of Bias** \rightarrow
 - Implicit Bias: Unconscious attitudes that influence interactions and decisions.
 - Explicit Bias: Conscious, deliberate prejudices based on stereotypes.
- Impact on Healthcare Delivery \rightarrow
 - Patient Outcomes: Biased decisions affect treatment, adherence, and health outcomes.
 - Communication: Bias affects patient-provider interactions and trust.
 - Health Disparities: Marginalized groups experience inequitable care due to bias.

>> Strategies to Mitigate Bias

- Awareness: Recognize your own personal biases and their impact.
- Education: Train health care professionals on implicit bias and cultural humility.
- Self-Reflection: Regularly assess decision-making and interactions.
- Cultural Humility: Approach patients with openness, curiosity, and respect.

Respecting Patients' Choices and Practices: \rightarrow

- Individual Autonomy: Honor patients' preferences and decisions.
- Shared Decision-Making: Collaborate with patients in treatment choices.
- Cultural Humility: Understand diverse practices and beliefs.
- Non-Judgmental Attitude: Accept differences without prejudice.
